This book represents the compilation of papers presented at the IFIP Working Group 8. 2 conference entitled "Information Technology in the Service Economy: Challenges and Possibilities for the 21 Century. " The conference took place at Ryerson University, Toronto, Canada, on August 10-13, 2008. Participation in the conference spanned the continents from Asia to Europe with paper submissions global in focus as well. Conference submissions included completed research papers and research in progress reports.
